Minutes of the 2022 A.G.M. of the GLAMORGAN COUNTY GOLF UNION on Tuesday 21st February 2023.

Present: Mike Evans, President in the Chair, Jonathan Williams (County Chairman) with representatives from Constituent Clubs and Officers and Members of the County Executive.

In opening the meeting, the Chairman thanked all for their attendance and reported the sad loss of two County stalwarts Peter Austerberry and Teg Bevan. An appreciation of both men was shown with a round of applause.

1)The Secretary called the Roll of Delegates and representatives from 22 clubs were confirmed as present with 29 members in attendance.

2) The Meeting approved the Minutes of the 2021 AGM held at Southerndown Golf Club

on Tuesday February 22nd 2022 as a true record.

3) CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

The President reported that Tony James had been elected to the position of Chairman but had resigned for personal reasons and Vice-Chairman Jonathan Williams had taken on the role for most of 2022.

Jonathan Williams gave his first report as Chairman stating that the full report was on the Website and in the Annual report. He thanked all the volunteers who run Glamorgan County Golf from the Junior section to the Seniors. He also thanked the clubs for their support without which we would be unable to run our events.

This was Glamorgan's first uninterrupted year of competition after the covid years and turned out to be very successful indeed. During 2022 Glamorgan produced 14 Welsh Internationals across the board with the Juniors' and |Men's Welsh Captains being Glamorgan players.

The Men's team under the leadership of Jordan Price-Davies and Rhys Clark won the Channel League and the Welsh Counties' Championship for the second year running. The very first time that the double double had been achieved. Richard Hooper was congratulated for attaining his 100th County cap, whilst the Wessex Team won the triple by winning the Wessex League, the Wessex Salver and the South Wales Shield. A big thank you to Alistair Mason who is stepping down as Team Manager to concentrate on the County Seniors section, and to Kyle Davies who will take his place. The Seniors finished second in both the Channel League and the South Wales Seniors League, losing the latter on countback. Thanks to Steve Watkins and Jeff Thomas for all their hard work.

Again, many thanks go to Junior managers Paul Melding, James Coombes and James Pontin and special thanks to Mark Evans the Juniors' Chairman for putting everything together throughout the year. It seems that the Junior coaching is coming to fruition and leading the boys nicely into the Wessex/ First Teams. It was the 50th anniversary of the Severnside competition at Whitchurch which saw Glamorgan defeat Gwent, Worcestershire and Gloucestershire to win the trophy.

Congratulations go to Craig Melding on winning the Glamorgan OOM, Harry Frazer for the County Championship, Brent O'Neill for the County Mid /Am, Paul Lewis for the Seniors County Championship and Tom Peet for the Colts Championship.

On the Team front Pyle & Kenfig won the County Premier League, Mountain Ash the KO Cup, and Neath the Welsh Team Championship. The Chairman thanked Rhys Carhart for running the County leagues and went on to thank everybody involved in Glamorgan golf for their hard work and wished them a successful golfing year ahead.

The President paid tribute to Jonathan who has combined the role of Chairman with his role as Welsh Team Captain and has done a great job for Glamorgan.

4) FINANCIAL REPORT.

The County Treasurer, Robert Arbourne presented the accounts and Financial Report. He reported a deficit of £11,678. We had an increase on revenue of £8868 compared to 2021, but also had an increase in expenditure of £16,782

He highlighted a few categories:

- Team expenses were up just over £10.000.
- Clothing was down £6162.
- Junior Expenses was up £9269. There has been a drive to increase our expenditure in developing our junior squads.

Last year we paid back £6955.00 to clubs from the 2020 accounts. This was monies they had paid for their Affiliation fee for 2020, where all monies should have been returned. Whilst there has been a small increase in Affiliation fees, the County must show prudence in our expenditure for 2023. He called on all team Captains, Championship organizers and Executive members, to please be aware of our spending in the forthcoming year.

He thanked our accountants CHP of Cardiff, and especially Tim Robinson in preparing the accounts.

Finally, he thanked all forty-two golf clubs in the County and their members for supporting the County year on year.

8) ANY OTHER COMPETENT BUSINESS.

The President reported that it was the intention of the Executive to try to establish County Ambassadors in each of our affiliated clubs with the intention of improving information links with the clubs. This would include informing members of what the County does, what therefore each member is getting for their £6 contribution. Some discussion took place as to why the County affiliation fee had recently risen from £5 to £6 and that it was the job and desire for ambassadors to inform clubs where at present there seems to be little knowledge of what the Golf Union does. It was agreed to further the Ambassador process as much as possible.

Jeff Thomas thanked the County for the way that the Seniors section is supported and discussion took placed regarding the Welsh Seniors team. Unfortunately, Wales Golf is unable to support certain aspects of International Seniors golf due to financial constraints.

There being no further items of substantive business the Chairman closed the meeting at 7.35pm, and thanked the Delegates for their attendance.

Glamorgan County Golf Union

Chairman's Report 2023.

The 2023 season has come to an end and it was another tremendous year for Glamorgan Golf.

Before we review the season I would like to, on behalf of everyone on the Glamorgan Executive, say a big thank you to Mr Rhys Carhart and Mr Robert Arbourne, who have both stepped down from their roles on the Glamorgan Executive Committee, for all the work, support, endeavour, and drive they have given over the past few years.

Coaching

Development of our sport is part of the DNA of Glamorgan Golf and we believe that golfers in our region should have access to the best coaching available during their development. Our head coach and National Coach for Wales, Mr Neil Matthews, has done a spectacular job in assessing the strengths and weaknesses of our system and delivered, along with other coaches such as John McDonald and Keith Williams, a framework we can all be proud of. Thanks to our coaches and everyone who has supported our programmes this year.

International Golf

It is always an honour to represent your country and 2023 has again shown that Glamorgan Golf is producing golfers, at all ages, to represent Wales Golf.

Nigel Edwards & Carl Rowe have again supported GB&I Captain Stuart Wilson, in losing narrowly to the USA in the Centenary of the Walker Cup played at St Andrews. We wish both Nigel and Carl the very best in 2024, as the St Andrews Trophy will played against Europe at Royal Porthcawl.

The Wales Men's team was represented by Matthew Roberts (Royal Porthcawl) at Royal Waterloo in Belgium. Matt played some sparkling golf and matchplay wins against Germany and Switzerland allowed Wales to finish 10th and qualify for the event, which will be held in Italy, in 2024.

In the Home Internationals, at Machynys Golf Club in Dyfed, the men's squad, once again included Matthew Roberts. After difficult matches against Ireland, a win against England on the second day gave Wales an outside chance, on the final day, to win the Home Internationals for the second time in their history. However, a narrow loss to Scotland on the final green, in the last match, meant the game was lost 5.5 to 6.5 but the performance was hugely encouraging.

The Welsh Boys European Team were captained by ex-Walker Cup player Mr Llewelyn Matthews (Southerndown). The team included Brodi Lewis (Southerndown) Ryan Williams

(Bargoed) and James Howell (Cardiff). A final day victory against Scotland 4 -3 allowed Wales to medal and finish 3rd. They will be promoted to Division one in 2024.

The Home internationals for Boys and Girls returned to England with Lindrick being the host Venue. Ryan Williams, Brodi Lewis, and James Howell again featured.

William Pontin represented Wales at Under 16 in the Quadrangular Event held in Holland. Wales, Scotland, Holland & Ireland taking part.

William Pontin, Paul Reid and Matthew Lewis were also selected by Wales to play in a friendly match, against Surrey, in August.

The Seniors Internationals were held at West Kilbride Golf Club in Scotland. The Welsh Seniors team included Gwyn Jones, Nigel Evans and Neil Roderick from Glamorgan.

Congratulations to everyone who represented Wales in 2023.

Channel League

It was always going to be a difficult for our Channel League team to retain and maintain the standards of the previous two years, as the reigning champions. That said Glamorgan, were very keen to retain the trophy won in 2021 & 2022.

The team of Jordon Price Davies (Captain) and, in his last year as Channel League manager, Rhys Clark had the hardest task of picking from an incredibly strong squad.

The Channel League started with a match at Royal Porthcawl against Wiltshire. The team played very well eventually came out on top with a 10 -5 win. A great start to the season.

The following game was against our local rivals Gwent. This match was again comfortable, and a good afternoon singles session was enough for another wln, 9.5-5.5.

Next was Devon away at Woodbury Park. This game was very close and a last gasp single win for Devon produced, probably against the run of play, an 8 -7 victory for Devon.

A home match followed, this time against Cornwall at Pyle & Kenfig. A magnificent display for the team in windy conditions saw them return to winning ways with a 9.5 to 5.5 victory.

The next match would as always be a close affair against Gloucestershire, at Forest Hills. A very close affair, by two very strong sides, ended up in a halved game 7.5 to 7.5. It kept us in the fight for the Channel League title, but Glamorgan would need two big wins in their remaining fixtures to hold on to the trophy.

Needing a big win against the newly reintroduced Dorset side, at Southerndown, was required to keep the team's chances alive and a clean sweep in the morning foursomes provided a 5-0 start to the game that Glamorgan needed. However, a gritty performance from Dorset, in the PM singles, meant that Glamorgan only narrowly won the game 8-7.

This meant that a 13 -2 victory in the last game against Somerset away would be required for Glamorgan to retain the league title.

The Final game was played at Weston Super Mare. The expectation here was high but a long day followed and Somerset came out on top in another close game 8-7. A fantastic effort from all the players that have pulled on the Glamorgan colours this year. Jordon and the team will already be planning their strategy over the winter to try and win the trophy back in 2024.

My thanks go to the Captain Jordon Price Davies, and Rhys Clark our Channel League Manager in his last year. Rhys has changed the emphasis in the Men's Golf over the last three to four years and it is no surprise that the organisational improvements and the determination of all the management and teams are seeing the rewards of their hard work.

Welsh Counties Championships

The Welsh Counties championships was played at Carmarthen Golf Club and Glamorgan sent a strong team of Keiron Harmon, Ryan Nedza, Craig Melding, Luke Thomas, Nick James, and Captain Jordon Price Davies.

Glamorgan won the event by a huge 19 shots from Caernarfonshire. Craig Melding winning the Individual event with a total of – 4. Congratulations to the team.

Men's Wessex Team

The Wessex team had a transitional year in 2023. Kyle Davies took over as Captain from the successful Mr Alistair Mason. Kyle's ambition is to promote some of the Juniors, approaching age 18 and transition them into men's game.

It has been a very difficult year for our Wessex squad with defeats against Gloucestershire, Gwent, Dyfed and Brecon & Radnor, but that said, a lot of younger players have begun their journey into men's golf and I'm sure that in 2024 there will be an improvement in our performance.

I'd like to thank Kyle for all his work this year and look forward to watching the results from the Wessex team in the future.

Juniors

Development Squad.

The Development squad had 10 hours of winter coaching delivered to them in preparation for the season. Our thanks go to Keith Williams from the Vale looking after the squad.

The season started well at the County Spring meeting with several of the boys taking part and warming up for the under 12s Order of merit, which was held throughout the 2023 season. We had 24 boys in the squad who took part, achieving order of merit points over the season. It is a positive for Glamorgan Golf seeing so many of the squad playing competitive golf at such an early age.

As always there were winners with Macsen Dyer of Swansea Bay taking the Order of merit title over 5 events.

With Flynn Lamby (Radyr) winning the U12 County Championship and Noah Hill (Aberdare) winning the Under 9 event.

In 2023 we continued the Development league with the intention of getting new juniors onto the golf course for the first time and we had continued support from the clubs around the county signing up to play in the league. The year finished off with a Finals Day at Llanishen in October. Cottrell Park took the honours but it was great to see all the clubs involved introducing over 60 new junior golfers from their academies to the golf course.

We look forward to 2024 with the knowledge that we have great support from the clubs in the county to get as many under 12s into the county Development squad as we can.

Under 14s

The Under 14 squad were coached by John McDonald in their preparation for the 2023 season with all their winter coaching being held at Llantrisant and Pontyclun golf club.

The under 14s were led by their captain James Palfrey of the Swansea Bay golf club.

Glamorgan played two matches throughout the season starting with a game at the Grove against Somerset where we were competitive but on the wrong end of a close game. Our second game was away to Gloucestershire which brought the U14's their first win in 2023.

The season was finished off in great fashion when Thomas Mclean won the Glamorgan Under 14s County Championship.

We are sure that 2024 will be a very enjoyable and successful season.

Under 16s

2023 was a year of emerging talent in the Squad. The preparation was started throughout the early months and new management duo of James Pontin and Morgan Williams bringing areas such as strength and conditioning and range sessions.

The side played six fixtures under the new captain William Pontin. The opening fixture at home was a loss to a strong Wiltshire team followed by another close loss to Somerset. The remainder of the season finished on a positive for the team with wins against Gloucestershire at home and away against Brecon and Radnor. The team also triumphed as the U16 South Wales team champions.

The Under 16 County Championships was won by Paul Reid.

Under18s

Our competitive golf season commenced against Gwent, at Tredegar Park Golf Club. The boys delivered a comfortable win 10 -5 and a great opening to the season.

The next competitive outing was the Severnside Tournament at Ross on Wye. Worcestershire and Gloucestershire brought very strong sides to the two-day event providing very stiff opposition for the Glamorgan team. The event featured some fantastic golf from all four counties involved with Glamorgan finishing as runners up for 2023.

Following Severnside we had two home Channel League games against Somerset and Gloucestershire. Both games were very competitive and hard fought against very strong opposition with the first against Somerset ending in a close game going down 9-6.

The match against Gloucestershire again proved a very tough test with the team going down 9.5 to 5.5.

A closing victory against Wiltshire 9.5 to 5.5 was a positive way to end a season of hard work by all the players.

Our final competitive team outing was at the U18 / U16 Channel League Final at Clyne Golf Club. The boys gave an excellent account of themselves running out as winners following up the runners up spot for 2022. The team of Ryan Williams, Harry Coombes, Brodi Lewis, Will Pontin, Paul Reid and Rhys English enjoying the success.

Thanks to all the players for their efforts in 2023, and with several players entering men's golf next year, we hope the transition to our Wessex and Channel League golf is seamless.

Junior Leagues

Senior Channel League

2023 was the year in which Glamorgan Golf Seniors regained the Channel League and collected the Duncan Samuel Trophy.

Captain Jeff Thomas and his team went unbeaten all year with 5 wins and 2 halves in a league which also had Dorset in the League for the first time. The work, effort and organisation by Jeff, Adrian Bragg, Steve Watkins and Ed Morgan in the run up to the season proved vital in taking the trophy from Devon, who had excelled in the last 2 years.

It was great to see Nigel Evans return to golf in Glamorgan in 2023 and we congratulate him on winning the West of England, Steve Hopkins Trophy, South Wales Senior Championship and the Welsh Order of Merit.

Mid-Amateur

The Mid-Amateur Championship was held this year at Whitchurch Golf Club, Kyle Davies (Cregiau Golf Club) overcome a strong field to win the event with a Gross score of 67.

National Competition

Pyle & Kenfig won the Welsh Team Championships at Porthmadog, defeating Glamorganshire in the Final. It was Pyle and Kenfig's second win in three years after losing in the final last year.

Pyle and Kenfig also won the Victory Shield competition when the pair of Tom Peet and Sean David overcame Ryan Nedza and Craig Melding, of Neath Golf Club, in the final.

The Welsh Amateur Championship was played at Newport Golf Club. Six of the top ten qualifiers were from Glamorgan. The winner of the Strokeplay section was, again, Keiron Harmon with superb rounds of 67 & 69 to finish -8. In all, 9 players from Glamorgan qualified for the last 32 of the match play. Our best placed finisher was Tim Harry who lost on the 18th in the Semi Finals.

In the Welsh Open Youths tournament at Creigiau Golf Club, Sean David was the highest placed player from Glamorgan finishing 4th.

The Welsh Events for the year got off to a great start. Tom Savill finishing joint 2nd at the Duncan Putter, Keiron Harmon finishing 5th at the Welsh Strokeplay and Ryan Nedza winning the Clwyd Open. There were some other notable performances during 2023 with Matt Roberts finishing 5th in the Irish Open Strokeplay and 10th in the Brabazon at Sunningdale Golf Club.

Congratulations to everyone involved.

At Seniors level our congratulations must go to Mr Gwyn Jones (Radyr Golf Club) winning the Welsh closed seniors at Aberdovey. In the Seniors Welsh Open at Ashburnham Richard Evans was the best placed Glamorgan player.

In Junior golf the Welsh Boys Championship was played at Cardigan Golf Club. James Howell was the best placed Glamorgan player in the qualifying rounds, finishing joint third, and he was joined by 8 other Glamorgan players in the last sixteen. James Howell, Harry Coombs & Ryan Williams all made the Quarter Finals.

Paul Reid won the final of the Plate.

In the Welsh Boys' U16 Championship held at Cardiff Golf Club, Paul Reid (Glamorganshire Golf Club) finished 2nd with a 54-hole total of 216. In the U14 competition Thomas Mclean (Pennard Golf Club) was best Glamorgan player with rounds of 76 & 80 finishing 5th. Well done to all that took part.

Leagues

The Premier League this year was again won by the amazing performance of Pyle & Kenfig winning every league match in in 2023. They will be the team to beat again in 2024.
